#### On the Liberty Line: Early Black History in St. Catharines

💷 Grades 3-12 | 60-90 minutes

Trace the journey to freedom through a history of slavery and emancipation, racism and prejudice, while exploring the lives of St. Catharines' first African-Canadian settlers in this interactive program. Study guide available.

## **Adventure-Style Programs and Experiences**

#### Hiking Through History at Mountain Locks Park or Jaycee Gardens

#### Grades 6-8 | Half-Day Program | Available Sept/Oct/May/June

Students will participate in fun, interactive, exploration-based activities while learning about the Welland Canals and our City's local built heritage. #### Where's the Pig? in Downtown St. Catharines

In this guided adventure program, students will use primary sources and inferencing skills to gather clues and determine the location of a real-life pig that got loose on the streets of St. Catharines in 1945.

#### Last Stop: the Underground Railroad in Downtown St. Catharines Walking Tour

#### 🔣 Grades 6-8 | Full Day Program | Available May/June

Take a guided walking tour of Downtown St. Catharines to visit locations significant to the Freedom Seekers who found refuge in St. Catharines and learn about their experiences here. Hear stories of their settlement in Coloured Town, the work of local abolitionists, and Harriet Tubman's time at the Salem Chapel. This full-day tour includes a tour of Salem Chapel, British Methodist Episcopal Church, National Historic Site.

#### History Hunters: The Case of the Stolen Violin



Help! A secret organization is trying to erase a famous St. Catharines violinist from history and steal her fame! We are calling on the curious and the inquisitive to help us piece together history before it's too late! History Hunters is a virtual history-adventure program delivered over three one-hour sessions. Staff will assist young researchers and guide them through the investigative process as they gather clues and help solve the mystery of the stolen violin.

Museum Classroom: Cargo on the
Welland Canal
Lesson: Cargo on the Welland Canal
Topic: The Welland Canals
Sub-Topic: Cargo on the ships of the Welland Canal
Grade: 1-3
Activity: Cargo Game
Materials Required:
Thermo Regimen.
• Small ball
• 2-3 chairs or small furniture items
• 6 small objects to represent cargo (i.e. tennis ball, mason jar, bean bag,
etc.)
• A SMILE
Materials Provided:

Pre-Lesson: Hot Potato Activity
With a friend or family members, play a round or two of "Hot Potato"
using a small ball as a warm up exercise. Arrange yourselves into a circle
and toss a small, round object (i.e. tennis ball) to each other while music
plays. The player who is holding the hot potato when the music stops is
out. The game continues until one player is left as the winner. Players will
understand the concept of the passing of an object from one point to

\$4.55/student, Elementary, \$4.65/student, Secondary, (HST included) for guided tours, programs, and experiences except the Jr. Travelling Museum and Travelling Museum programs which are presented free of charge.
