

Elected Municipal Councils of St. Catharines 1845 to 2026

In March, 1845, St. Catharines becomes a corporate town governed by a Board of Police, by virtue of 8 Vic. C. 63 (29 March).

First meeting of the town council – May 9, 1845. Alpheus St. John chosen President of the Board of Police (chosen from the group of elected councillors).

Note: By virtue of a change in 1817 of the 1793 legislation (33 Geo.III c.2) elections were to be held on the first Monday in January of each year. Two-day elections were common.

Town Council

The President is now called the Mayor. The mayor and reeves are chosen from among the elected aldermen. The first meeting in the new Town Hall Municipal Offices took place on January 29, 1850.
